# 2. APPROVE MINUTES OF JULY 19, 2018 MEETING

# NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES OF PUBLIC MEETING (DRAFT) (July 19, 2018)

The meeting was called to order by Chair DePalma at 4 p.m in Eberhardt Hall, NJIT Alumni Center Boardroom, NJIT Campus, Newark, N.J. In attendance were Chair DePalma, Vice Chairs DeCaprio and Raia, Board Members Bone, Cistaro, Cohen, Montalto, Taylor and Toft. Absent: Board Member Sugla.

Administrative members in attendance were President Bloom, Provost and Sr. Executive Vice President Deek, Sr. Vice Presidents Bishof and Sebastian, Vice Presidents Alexo, Iyer and Christ, and Vice President/Secretary Stern. Absent: Dean Boger.

1. In accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, Chair DePalma read the following statement:

"Notice of this Meeting was provided to the public as required by the New Jersey Open Public Meeting Act, in the Schedule of Meeting Dates of the Board of Trustees of the New Jersey Institute of Technology which was mailed and sent electronically to the Star Ledger, the Herald News and the Vector on August 9, 2017, and posted on the University website. This Schedule was also mailed and sent electronically to the County Clerk on August 9, 2017 for filing with that office and posting in such public place as designated by said Clerk."

- 2. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. COHEN, SECONDED BY DR. DeCAPRIO and unanimously approved, the Board approved the public minutes of the meeting of June 7, 2018, with abstentions from those members not in attendance at such meeting.
- 3. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. BONE, SECONDED BY MS. GARCIA AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR FY19 OPERATING & CAPITAL BUDGET.
- 4. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. BONE, SECONDED BY MS. MONTALTO AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR FY19 TUITION AND FEE SCHEDULE.
- 5. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. CISTARO, SECONDED BY MS. GARCIA AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION TO APPOINT TRUSTEE OFFICERS FOR FY19.
- 6. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY DR. DeCAPRIO, SECONDED BY MR. COHEN AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR FACULTY APPOINTMENT WITH TENURE, BARUCH SCHIEBER.

- 7. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. CISTARO, SECONDED BY MS. MONTALTO AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION TO FOR NJIT TO APPROVE THE EXTENSION OF THE CONDITIONAL DESIGNATION OF THE PRC GROUP FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MLK GATEWAY, BLOCK 43 LOT 38, 39, 40, 41, 46, 48 and BLOCK 2858.
- 8. BY A MOTION DULY MADE BY MR. RAIA, SECONDED BY MR. CISTARO AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED, the Board voted to APPROVE RESOLUTION FOR THE NJIT GUARANTY OF NJII LEASE.
- 9. President Bloom gave his report to the Board. He thanked the Board for its ongoing support for the building of our Wellness and Events Center, which was intended to support multiple purposes, including serving as a conference center. On July 23<sup>rd</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup>. We will host the VOICE conference sponsored by Amazon Alexa. This is an international conference with over 1500 attendees, including leaders in voice technology, including Amazon's "Chief Technology Evangelist." We are looking forward to this inaugural event, and Bloomberg radio will be telecasting the event all day. Dr. Bloom also reported that he and Mr. Christ received an award from NJBIA recognizing NJIT's work at the Central King Building. Marjorie Perry and Marvel Architects made the nomination.
- 10. Dr. Deek gave a report on our new faculty hires; their bios appear in the Board materials at p. 35. This is the third cohort under the Faculty Hiring Plan, and we have nearly completed with the exception of one search. Dr. Deek commended the new slate of excellent faculty candidates.
- 11. With respect to the report of Intangible Assets, there will be no presentation, however, the materials are included in the Board materials.
- 12. Vice President Alexo reporting on FY 2018 Fundraising Update and Preliminary Final Numbers. He referred to the highlights set forth in the handout with the Board materials. The good news is that we have surpassed the Campaign goal of \$200 million, and exceeded our goal for the fiscal year. Additionally, the Annual Fund goal has been exceeded. There is only one area where we are disappointed, and that is with the alumni participation rate. However, we have increased the number of donors.
- 13. Treasurer Bishof reported on the Operating Statement Year to Date and Schedule of Short Term Investments, which are detailed in the Board Materials. We ended the fiscal year with a minor surplus of about \$1 million. At the Audit & Finance Committee level, Grant Thornton made a presentation explaining its role as Auditor. Our cash and cash equivalent level as of June 30, 2018 is close to \$117.3 million. Fiscally, we are in good shape and this level exceeds where we were one year ago.
- 14. Vice President Christ gave a report on the Clery Crime Data provided to the Board in the materials. At page 70, there is an information summary, noting a 43% reduction in reported crimes compared to the same period in 2017.

- 15. Chair DePalma discussed the Schedule of Meetings set forth in the Board materials as well as the Schedule of Events. He called the Board's attention to the Convocation scheduled for September 12, 2018, encouraging all to attend.
- 16. The Chair announced that the next regularly scheduled Closed Session will be convened on Thursday, September 20, 2018 at 2 p.m. in Eberhardt Hall Alumni Center Board Room, to discuss personnel, real estate, legal and contractual matters. The following resolution was read and approved by all Trustees present:

### STATEMENT

RESOLUTION OF NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ("NJIT") APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF THE CONDITIONAL DESIGNATION OF THE PRC GROUP FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MLK GATEWAY, BLOCK 43 LOTS 38, 39, 40, 41, 46, 48, BLOCK 2857, AND BLOCK 2858

# Background:

In September 2007, NJIT, in cooperation with other area stakeholders, created the NJIT Campus Gateway Plan for the redevelopment and rehabilitation of approximately 21.5 acres of land located within the City of Newark in order to serve as a gateway between the NJIT campus and existing neighborhoods and enhance the quality of life of both NJIT and existing residential communities.

In July 2018, the Board of Trustees of NJIT extended the conditional designation of the PRC Group, located in West Long Branch, New Jersey for the MLK Gateway Phase of the NJIT Campus Gateway Plan through September 20, 2018. To date, PRC has made good progress with the investigation, analysis, and due diligence on the MLK Gateway Phase of the project.

The PRC Group is moving forward with the design of the redevelopment on the 240 MLK property, the initial component of the MLK Gateway phase. Currently, we are negotiating the final business terms for the Development and Operating agreements between NJIT and the PRC Group. They will apply for approvals through the Newark Central Planning Board, City of Newark Landmarks and Historic Preservation Commission, and the State of New Jersey Historic Preservation office, in the coming months and will begin the demolition of the existing structures once they receive approvals from the City. A revised pro-forma has been constructed and funding sources are being explored through private and public funding agencies. Environmental investigation has been completed and the cost to remediate is included in the revised pro-forma for the development.

In addition, the PRC Group has been diligent in their pursuit of Saint Michael's Medical Center (SMMC), a major property holder, to negotiate the final land sale, but progress with SMMC has been extremely slow. They have pursued other properties within the designated blocks and have reached a tentative agreement with one landowner. NJIT, PRC Group, and the City of Newark are working toward acquisition of the property on the corner of MLK Blvd. and James Street, a key component in the early development of the western portion of the MLK Gateway Phase. We anticipate some resolution on the west side in the coming months and expect PRC to continue their effort to date.

# Implication:

- Granting an extension of the conditional developer designation provides exclusivity to PRC Group allowing for the appropriate development analysis, investigation, and due diligence to be completed.
- If progress is not deemed satisfactory, NJIT has the right to terminate or let expire this
  conditional designation.
- NJIT will negotiate a Development and Operating Agreement with the PRC Group for the initial component of the MLK Gateway Phase, commonly known as 240 MLK Blvd, an NJIT owned property, by the April 2019 Board of Trustees meeting.

# Recommendation:

Grant the extension of the conditional developer designation through April 12, 2019 with a condition of a complete and executable Development and Operating agreement be presented to the Board of Trustees on or before their April 11, 2019 meeting for approval. In addition, PRC will provide an update to the administration prior to the November 2018 and February 2019 Board of Trustees meeting, allowing analysis of progress to date on the entitlements and west side phases.

# RESOLUTION OF NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ("NJIT") APPROVING THE EXTENSION OF THE CONDITIONAL DESIGNATION OF THE PRC GROUP FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE MLK GATEWAY, BLOCK 43 LOTS 38, 39, 40, 41, 46, 48, BLOCK 2857, AND BLOCK 2858

WHEREAS, on July 19, 2018, the NJIT Board of Trustees extended the conditional designation of the PRC Group as developers of the MLK Gateway Sub-Project through September 20, 2018; and

WHEREAS, substantive progress continues to be made in the negotiations between New Jersey Institute of Technology and the development team; and

WHEREAS, additional time is necessary to negotiate the terms of the development and operating agreement on Phase 1 of the MLK Gateway Sub-project, plan the project outcomes, negotiate property acquisition, finalize development details, acquire financing, and procure entitlements from the Newark Central Planning Board, City of Newark Landmarks and Historic Preservation Commission, and the NJ State of New Jersey Historic Preservation office;

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE NEW JERSEY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY BOARD OF TRUSTEES HEREBY:

- 1. Extends the previously issued conditional designation of the PRC Group as the developer of the MLK Gateway sub-project, in its entirety, until April 12, 2019.
- 2. Requires the final negotiation of the development and operating agreement for the 240 MLK property and its presentation to the Board of Trustees for review no later than March 14, 2019, allowing action at their April 11, 2019 meeting.
- Conditionally designates the CGF Entity, with PRC Group as a partner therein, to carry out the redevelopment of the Project, subject to the following conditions:
  - (i) The proposal for the Project shall be subject to the consideration of and approval by this Board of Trustees in its sole discretion.
  - (ii) CGF and PRC Group, or affiliates thereof, shall enter into a mutually acceptable joint venture agreement forming the CGF Entity that complies with the Redevelopment Agreement.
  - (iii) NJIT and the CGF Entity shall enter into the Development Agreement and an Operating and/or Joint Venture LLC Agreement on terms and conditions to be considered by and if the Board deems them appropriate to be approved by this Board of Trustees in its sole discretion.
  - (iv) PRC Group shall provide interim updates to NJIT on the status of the development of its proposal, and the Board reserves its right to

terminate or let expire the designation if the Board concludes that there has not been sufficient evidence of progress on the satisfaction of these conditions. The update shall be provided on or before March 14, 2019.

- 4. Affirms that all conditions in the June 9, 2016, June 1, 2017, and November 9, 2017, June 7, 2018, and July 19, 2018 resolutions remain valid and binding.
- 5. Grants no rights to PRC Group with respect to the Project other than the right to negotiate exclusively as described above and in prior resolutions of the Board, and grants no rights to the development of same, any such rights to be established exclusively in the Development Agreement, Parking Agreement, and Joint Venture/LLC Agreement if same can be agreed upon by and between the parties.

# 4B. APPROVE RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE EXCLUSIVE LICENSE OF UNIVERSITY INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY – AI VACUA LLC

# STATEMENT OF INFORMATION FOR EXCLUSIVE LICENSE OF NJIT INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

# Introduction

As part of its Intellectual Property ("IP") Program, New Jersey Institute of Technology ("NJIT") assesses the commercial value of its IP to determine the most appropriate avenue to achieve a return on its investment and facilitate the introduction of its innovations into public use. Options include the exclusive licensing of NJIT patents.

AiVacua LLC. (AV) has expressed interest in acquiring an Exclusive Patent License Agreement ("License") for the two (2) NJIT IP assets listed below for the life of each patent issued by the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office related to the same.

As the License is proposed for the life of the patents arising out of the subject IP, it essentially represents a disposition of NJIT property and the Board of Trustees is being asked to approve the same. A "Resolution To Authorize Exclusive License Of University Intellectual Property" has been prepared for consideration.

## History and Description of Intellectual Property

The first IP asset for licensing is U.S. Non-Provisional Patent Application No. 15/617,612 filed on June 8, 2017 entitled "System and Method for Multi-Level Vacuum Generation and Storage" (NJIT Reference No. 16-034). This asset is the subject of three U.S. provisional patent applications: U.S. Provisional Patent Application No. 62/347,670; (NJIT Reference No. 16-034), U.S. Provisional Patent Application No. 62/393,142; (NJIT Reference No. 17-003) and U.S. Provisional Patent Application No. 62/396,313; (NJIT Reference No. 17-007). The NJIT inventors are Chao Zhu, Zhiming Ji, Mengchu Zhou, Joseph Glaz, and Bo Zhang. The IP covered under this patent application relates to a vacuum generation and storage system. This U.S. non-provisional patent application will have a twenty (20) year patent term from the date of filing. This technology includes a dual-action piston-cylinder, a multi-level vacuum generation system by wall-imbedded cooling and/or atomized spray cooling, and a multi-level vacuum storage system.

The second IP asset for licensing is U.S. Non-Provisional Patent Application No. 15/993,093 filed on May 30, 2018 entitled "Vacuum Distillation and Desalination" (NJIT Reference No. 17-031). The NJIT inventors are Chao Zhu, Zhiming Ji, Mengchu Zhou, Guangyu Guo, and Bo Zhang. This U.S. non-provisional patent application will have a twenty (20) year patent term from the date of filing. The IP covered under this patent application relates to distillation and desalination systems. The technology includes a vacuum thermal distillation system for liquid solutions containing an evaporative solvent and a non-evaporative solvent, solute or salt, such as salt found in sea water desalination, oil in oil-contaminated water, as well as solutes found for waste water treatment.

# Background of AiVacua LLC.

AV, a Delaware limited liability company, is located at 1 Pine Place, Annandale, New Jersey 08801. AV was established in 2018 by three NJIT inventors (Chao Zhu, Mengchu Zhou, and Zhiming Ji) and a business executive (Ben Hanafin). Chao Zhu, Mengchu

Zhou, and Zhiming Ji have technical expertise in design, robotics, automation, and system, environmental and reaction engineering to take the technology further. Ben Hanafin has represented that he has served as an interim executive in several technologies, such as software, railroad parts, food processing and medical devices companies. As president of PyMaH Corp., an international manufacturer of diagnostic medical devices, it has been represented that Ben Hanafin grew annual sales of the company from \$6 million to \$40 million. It has also been represented that PyMaH Corp grew through both internal product development and acquisition, eventually owning 290 active patents under his leadership. Given Ben Hanafin's extensive experience in new product development and the technical expertise of the three NJIT founders, NJIT believes AV will be able to commercialize the technology and facilitate the introduction of the innovation into public use within a short period. As such, AV is the best candidate to license the above NJIT IP assets and begin making products. Additionally, authorization for the License will provide future royalty revenues to NJIT that can fund protection of NJIT's patentable interests in new inventions having promise for future commercialization.

# **Current Licensing Offer**

NJIT and AV have discussed licensing opportunities that have resulted in this request for Board of Trustee approval for NJIT to enter into the License with AV, the terms of which AV has already accepted. The License requires AV to use diligent efforts to commercialize the NJIT technology to achieve the maximum in licensing payments and royalties to NJIT.

NJIT will receive seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) as an up-front licensing fee payment. In addition, NJIT will receive five thousand dollars (\$5,000) after the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the License and continuing through the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the License. After 5<sup>th</sup> year of the License and continuing through all subsequent contract years, NJIT will receive ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per year.

NJIT will receive a royalty of five percent (5%) on net product sales of each and any products manufactured or sold by AV within the U.S. NJIT will also receive a two percent (2%) royalty on all net product sales of each and any products manufactured or sold by AV outside of the U.S. where NJIT has no patent rights to protect the technology. If any of the patents is sublicensed to third parties, NJIT will also receive 25% of all fees received by AV.

Additionally, AV will pay for all reasonable patent prosecution and maintenance costs related to the technology incurred by NJIT after the effective date of the License. Such costs will include attorney fees, prior art searches, preparing and filing patent applications, maintenance fees, etc.

After NJIT's reimbursement of associated out-of-pocket expenses, if any, the remaining net amount derived from the transaction shall be shared with the inventors (who are not part of AV) pursuant to NJIT's current Patent Policy.

# RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE EXCLUSIVE LICENSE OF UNIVERSITY INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY



- THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of New Jersey Institute of Technology, that the Senior Vice Provost for Research is hereby authorized to execute any and all agreements or documents on behalf of NJIT to consummate the licensing transaction.



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

Attached, please find the final fundraising report for FY2018. This memo provides a brief examination of our performance during the past year, as well as some commentary and statistics that put this performance in context. Also included are our top-level goals for FY2019.


The key goals developed for FY2018 were as follows:

- 1. Secure \$14 million in overall philanthropic commitments (i.e., outright cash gifts, whole pledges, gifts-in-kind, and planned gifts, including documented bequest intentions).
- 2. Secure \$12 million in cash and irrevocable deferred gifts (i.e., outright cash gifts, pledge payments, gifts-in-kind, and irrevocable planned gifts).
- 3. Secure \$1.04 million in unrestricted gift income (i.e., gifts to the annual fund).
- 4. Increase the overall alumni participation rate to 8.2%.
- $5. \ \ Increase the undergraduate alumni participation \ rate to \ 10.4\%.$
- 6. Develop a system to measure alumni engagement and begin conducting market research targeting under-engaged alumni to evaluate programming and interests.
- 1. Overall philanthropic commitments. As Figure 1 below indicates, we secured \$14.9 million in outright cash gifts, whole pledges, gifts-in-kind, and revocable and irrevocable planned gifts during FY2018 nearly \$1 million more than our goal of \$14 million and an increase of roughly \$1.4 million over FY2017. The total amount secured is also \$1 million higher than the average annual amount secured during the previous five years (\$13,899,559).

Owing to the nearly \$15 million received during FY2018, we surpassed the revised \$200 million goal for the NJIT NEXT campaign, which finished with \$201,019,052 in gifts, pledges, and grants (the last were counted as part of the campaign through the end of FY2015). This final campaign tally was given by 23,725 unique donors. We are currently in the process of devising a plan for announcing and celebrating our NJIT NEXT success, and have initiated planning for NJIT's next comprehensive fundraising campaign.

**2. Cash and irrevocable deferred gifts.** We were likewise successful in surpassing our FY2018 goal of securing \$12 million in outright cash gifts, irrevocable planned gifts, and pledge payments. We finished the year with \$12,136,283, a modest increase of roughly \$60,000 over the previous year but nearly \$1.5 million higher than the prior five-year average. Figure 2 shows NJIT's cash and deferred performance since FY2013.




Figure 3. Annual Fund (Unrestricted) Cash, FY2013-2018

**3. Annual fund (unrestricted) giving.** The goal for unrestricted and directly budget-relieving giving for FY2018 was \$1.04 million. Thanks, in part, to a seven-figure unrestricted bequest, we surpassed this target by \$1.1 million. The \$2.1 million raised is the most that NJIT has received in the form of unrestricted gifts in at least the last six years, and is approximately \$800,000 higher than the prior five-year average. Figure 3 depicts the university's annual fund performance between FY2013 and FY2018.

**4-5. Alumni participation rates.** The only disappointing result from FY2018 was in the area of alumni participation rates. In FY2017, the university achieved an overall giving rate of 7.2% and an undergraduate alumni-only rate of 9.39%. Based on last year as well as the previous four, our FY2018 goal was to increase the overall alumni giving rate to 8.2% and the undergrad-only rate to 10.4%.




Figure 4. Alumni Participation Rates: FY2013-2018

Unfortunately – and largely on account of a denominator that was nearly 2,000 alumni larger this year compared to last – we did not hit either of these targets. The overall alumni giving rate grew slightly, finishing at 7.36%, while the undergrad alumni-only giving rate dropped to 9.17%. The silver lining, however, is that we increased the number of unique alumni donors who made a gift in FY2018: 174 more alumni made a gift this year compared to last year. Figure 4 below details NJIT's overall and undergrad-only alumni giving rates since FY2013.

Given the importance of undergraduate alumni participation as a key metric used by publications such as *U.S. News & World Report* to gauge the strength and reputation of a school, it is regrettable that we fell short of this particular goal for FY2018. It is equally important to bear in mind, however, that the 9.17% undergrad-only giving rate we achieved is still higher – and, in some cases, much higher – than the average alumni participation rates of our peer schools. According to the Council for Aid to Education's VSE data, this group – which includes Case Western, Louisiana Tech, UMass-Lowell, and Missouri University of Science and Technology – boasted an average participation rate of just 8.1% in FY2017 (the most recent data available).

That said, with the addition of a new staff member to the Annual Giving team, continued collaboration between Annual Giving and Alumni Relations, as well as the fuller adoption of strategies and tactics that include more segmented appeals, increased use of social media and other digital tools, an expanded focus on milestone reunion year giving, and greater engagement of alumni who graduated during the last decade, we fully anticipate that NJIT's overall and undergrad-only alumni giving rates will grow this coming year and in subsequent years. We further project that, despite moving the needle only marginally in FY2018, we remain on target to

hit the 2020 Vision strategic plan goal of achieving an 11% undergrad-only alumni participation rate.

**6. Alumni engagement metrics.** The fifth and final top-line goal for the Development & Alumni Relations office was to develop a system for measuring alumni engagement and using that system to create programming that targets those who are presently under-engaged. I am pleased to report that, by November 30, 2017, we had designed and begun to pilot an alumni engagement scoring system, based on best practices in the field. This system uses event attendance, giving history, volunteerism, and communications to create a numerical engagement score, with 4 as the base score for all alumni.

As Figure 5 above shows, our initial results from using this engagement scoring system revealed that 14.3% of our alumni (those scoring 4+) are at least modestly engaged with their alma mater – a number that we aim to increase to 25% over the course of the next five years. This metric will also guide our development of new programs or investment in existing ones, and has already led to the adoption of a new, multifaceted online alumni community ("Highlander Nation" on the PeopleGrove platform), which will be formally rolled out in September 2018, as well as the planning of a new program targeting current students and young alumni.

It is also worth adding here that the portion of alumni scoring at least a 4 ("Sustainers") had increased to 15.4% by the conclusion of FY2018.

Our goals for FY2019 have been established with a view both to building upon our various successes during the past year and to further bolstering the university's alumni engagement and fundraising efforts. These goals are as follows:

- 1. Secure \$16 million in overall philanthropic commitments (i.e., outright cash gifts, whole pledges, gifts-in-kind, planned gifts, including documented bequest intentions) with a continued focus on securing major support for the Wellness and Events Center and for endowed scholarships, fellowships, and professorships.
- 2. Secure \$13.5 million in cash and irrevocable deferred gifts (i.e., outright cash gifts, pledge payments, gifts-in-kind, and irrevocable planned gifts).
- 3. Secure \$1.25 million in unrestricted gift income (i.e., gifts to the annual fund).
- 4. Increase the overall alumni participation rate to 8.2% (stretch goal: 8.6%).
- 5. Increase the undergraduate alumni participation rate to 10.3% (stretch goal: 10.6%).
- 6. Increase the percentage of alumni with an engagement score of 4 or higher from 14.3% to 17%.




# FY19 TOTAL BUDGET: \$545,222 REVENUE DISTRIBUTION




## FY19 TOTAL BUDGET: \$545,222 EXPENSE DISTRIBUTION






### **EXPENDITURES BY PROGRAM**
